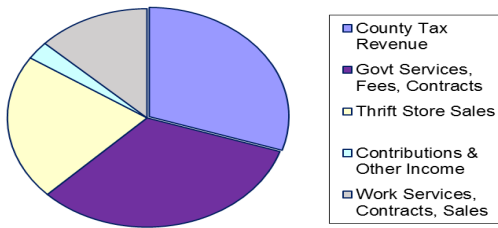

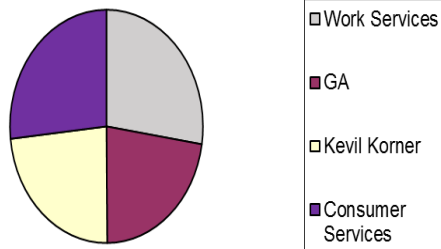

History of the Kevil Center

Mr. J. U. Kevil, 1882-1941 desired that his estate be left for the benefit of the Mayfield Graves County area. In 1965, the Kevil Will Committee appropriated about half of the estate to the J. U. Kevil Memorial Foundation, Inc. The purpose of the foundation was to build and aid in the operation of a comprehensive Mental Health-Mental Retardation Center and Opportunity Workshop. The first phase of construction was completed in 1968 at a total cost of \$425,000 with funds coming from the following sources: Federal Construction Grant—\$191,000, the State Department of Mental Health—\$59,000, and the J. U. Kevil Foundation—\$175,000. The second phase of construction, which added the sheltered workshop, was completed in November of 1972. The budget for the building and equipment was \$328,749. Funding sources for this project were: the Bureau of Rehabilitation—\$262,749, State Department of Mental Health—\$20,000 and the J. U. Kevil Foundation—\$45,688. A third phase of construction completed in 1992 added a warehouse and an additional work area. This project was funded as follows: Community Development Block Grant—\$147,500 and the J. U. Kevil Foundation—\$57,500.

Operation of the Kevil Center

The J. U. Kevil Memorial Foundation is a non-profit organization comprised of a nine member board of directors and an executive director. Board members are elected on a rotating basis and represent a wide variety of interests in the community. This board is an outgrowth of a local program which began in 1962.

Mission of the Kevil Center

Our goal is to provide quality programs and services to persons who have physical, mental, and/or developmental disabilities in a way that will preserve and promote dignity, independence, self-esteem, and personal growth. We will promote the removal of social, vocational, educational, and environmental barriers which deprive individuals of the opportunity to be self sufficient and socially integrated into the community. To accomplish these goals we will provide educational opportunities for skill enhancement, employment opportunities within our setting, and employment assistance within our community.

Services of the Kevil Center

The services of this Center and its staff are available to citizens of the area who qualify regardless of age, gender or sexual orientation, race, color, national origin, economic status, geographic location or spiritual beliefs. The geographic area served includes, but is not limited to, the following counties: Graves, Fulton, Hickman, Calloway, Carlisle, Marshall and McCracken.

Primary services are vocationally oriented and may include work services within our facility, or assistance with employment in the community. Additional programming is designed to improve social and/or independent living skills. Our goal is to provide each person with a number of options from which they can design a truly individualized program.

Provision of services is carefully guided by our Code of Ethics policy. Staff receive ongoing training to assure professional conduct in every situation. For more information about our services and possible outcomes, please contact us. No fees are charged for our services

Entry Criteria

- Age 25 and above.
- Age 16-24 must complete requirements under WIOA
- Appropriate documentation of employment related impairment.
- Ability to care for personal needs while in day program.
- Impairment or conduct should not put self or others at risk.
